



**KIMBALL PRIZE**

Mentor Memorandum of Understanding

The Kimball Prize is sponsored by Landmarks, Inc to promote awareness of historic buildings in Omaha, Nebraska. The prize is designed to recognize high school students who demonstrate an understanding of historical Omaha architecture. Students work in teams to create entries based on an historic building selected by Landmarks, Inc. 2008-09 is the pilot year for this program.

Mentors enrich the Kimball Prize program by providing historical perspective and serving as an information resource. Mentors will also work with teachers by providing materials and a framework for teachers to use in developing lesson plans. Landmarks, Inc will work with teachers to identify potential mentors and then contact to the mentors to schedule a presentation time. Landmarks will also provide relevant materials on the topic building.

In the interest of participating in the Kimball Prize program, the Mentor agrees to be responsible for one presentation and will do the following:

- Review the Kimball Prize Guidelines.
- Provide a brief description of your areas of expertise or presentation topics to share with teachers (below).
- Two weeks before your visit, provide materials for the teacher to use in preparation for your presentation such as a photo, a text, or exercise.
- Present and discuss materials with a group of approximately 30 students for a 2-hour period. Dedicate a portion of this time for guidance on entries for the Kimball Prize topic building.
- Attend the awards ceremony (no cost), tentatively May 8, 2009, 5-7 pm
